### WHY?

Over **35 years of research** and **41 independent evaluations** show that being regularly read to by a parent or caregiver before kindergarten is the most significant factor impacting a child's academic success.

Our mission is to close the literacy opportunity gap among children birth to age six in under-resourced communities by helping families develop and practice shared home reading habits.

Raising a Reader Massachusetts supports families to build, practice, and grow reading routines with their children. To do this, we give families the knowledge and resources necessary to be empowered participants in their child's education.

### WHO?

**7,288** children served by **110** trusted partner organizations, with **1,155** partner staff implementers, & support of **18** Community Ambassadors (CA)

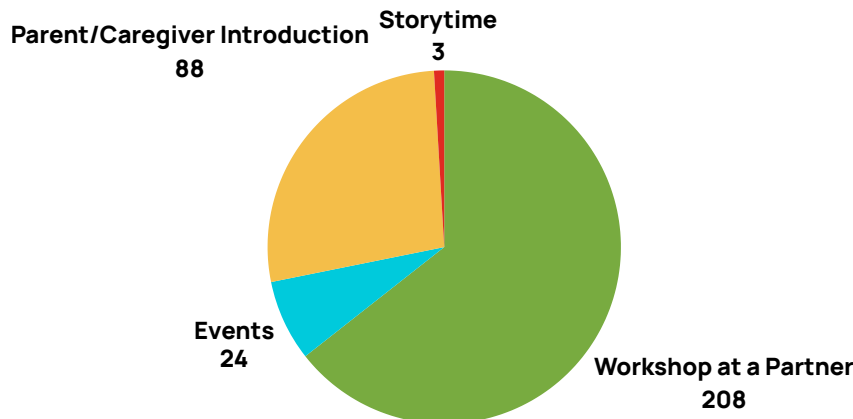
According to the 2024 MCAS results, **58% of third-grade students in Massachusetts** are either not meeting or only partially meeting expectations for English Language Arts. **That rate is as high as 86% in the communities we serve.**

## PARTNER SURVEY RESULTS:

The program team collaborates with partners each year to collect data. In FY2025 survey, our partners found that as a result of the Raising a Reader MA program, children in their programs showed:



91%

...have an enhanced interest in books.



84%

...have an increased curiosity about the world.



85%

...improved oral language skills.



63.5%

...of children are new to the RAR-MA program.

## OUR FY2025 IMPACT: By The Numbers

### REGIONAL SPOTLIGHT: Greater Boston Region

- 2,462 children served in this region
- Reported data from results of 609 survey responses - a 25% response rate



The program team collaborated with a regional cohort of partners to engage families in the survey. This is an anonymous retrospective survey asking for pre- and post-behavior. Families reported:



95%

...now have a routine for looking at books with their children.



96%

...of children served now ask to look at books at least five times per week.
